Shir comments that she is personally quite offended from the strong opposition to the Mosque: "It is hurting our religious feelings. We have been living here for two generations already and the community still won't accept us. We are equal and we deserve equal rights".

Later on, during the press conference, the Mayor **Tomasz Senda** said that according to his opinion, "Muslims are not being respected in this conflict. I think that we should give all Muslims in Sleepyville a chance for equality. I believe that eventually there is going to be a Mosque in Sleepyville".
